The Mumbai Leaders' Forum

Supporting AML/CFT in India

This workshop forms part of a UK-sponsored project to promote collaboration on the subject of Anti-Money Laundering and Combatting the Financing of Terrorism (AML/CFT) in India, working in partnership with Indian public and private sector stakeholders. The project is locally supported by KPMG in India and the Anti-Corruption Academy (ACA).

The Anti-Money Laundering Mumbai Leaders' Forum will convene discussion between regulators, law enforcement and the private sector, to cover the current challenges in the implementation of AML/CFT standards in India. The event will serve as a consultation and enable the collation of the practical challenges faced by the private sector, which will then go on to inform the remainder of the project, which will include capacity building workshops with Indian public authorities.

Sharing best practice in AML/CFT is a fundamental part of strengthening the international financial system and improving its resilience to all sorts of criminal misconduct, from serious and organised crime, to corruption and tax evasion. International and inter-agency cooperation in this field is crucial, to keep pace with the complex web of legitimate businesses and corporate structures employed by criminals to disguise their funds. In May this year, the UK hosted, and India attended, a major international summit on Anti-Corruption, at which many countries, including India and the UK, committed to strengthening inter-agency and international partnerships. This work is now underway and with new partnerships between investigating agencies developing, the prospects for pursuing this crime are as good as they have ever been.

Indian Context

In the Indian context, the galvanising of these efforts has never been more salient. Recent moves by the Indian Federal Government have raised the profile and highlighted the importance of AML, in turn reinforcing the pressing need for the country to utilise regional and international networks in order to maximise the impact of available resources and effectively tackle financial crime.

These workshops will provide an essential dialogue between international experts, law enforcement and regulated entities from the financial sector and Designated Non-Financial Businesses and Professions (DNFBPs). Today marks a small part of the large international effort which will be required to tackle these challenges in the years ahead.
